

Remember to add your enrichment activities to your InDesign portfolio as evidence of your understanding of Photography in the broadest sense.

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


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ENRICHMENT PROJECT 2



ACTIVITIES

How might continual observation by a photographer influence how relaxed, self-conscious or co-operative they are? IMPORTANT: Choose your subject with care and agreement of what photographs you can and can't take, and how these might be viewed by others. Liaise with your parents/carers and teacher if uncertain with this.



02 Family


